# Course Description:

This course is an introduction to biomedical ethics. The first parts of the course provide an introduction to ethics and basic ethical theory, which serve as background that aids for thinking through the particular issues discussed in the second part of the course. Specific topics to be discussed include principles and moral arguments related to bioethical issues such as brain death and organ transplantation; abortion; assisted reproductive technology; and euthanasia. The sources of Jordanian law, the distinction between civil and criminal law, and the law related to the bioethical issues noted above are examined. Additional legal issues related to health care practice such as the assault; battery; negligence; and privacy and confidentiality are investigated.

### **Course Learning Outcomes:**

On completion of this unit students should be able to:

- analyse and communicate the influence of personal and professional ethics on planning, organising, problem solving, and decision making in the health care setting;
- 2. analyse ethical issues and apply ethical theories, principles and concepts to health care;
- 3. analyse conditions in health care which impede ethically sensitive practice;
- 4. analyse and communicate the overlap between common and statute law as the two different types of law relate to the provision of health care;
- 5. Relate health professionals' responsibilities to such matters as negligence and consent.
